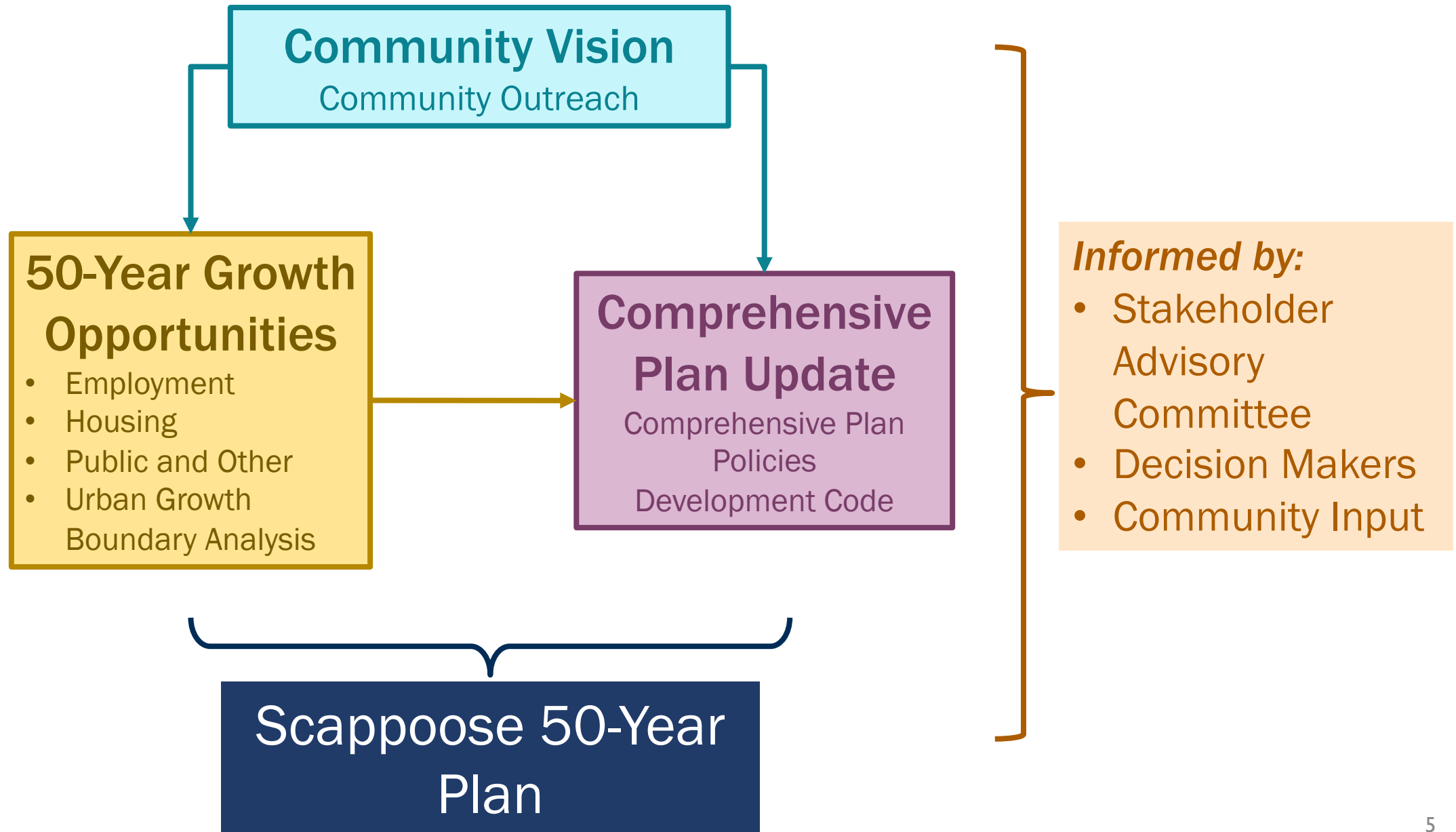

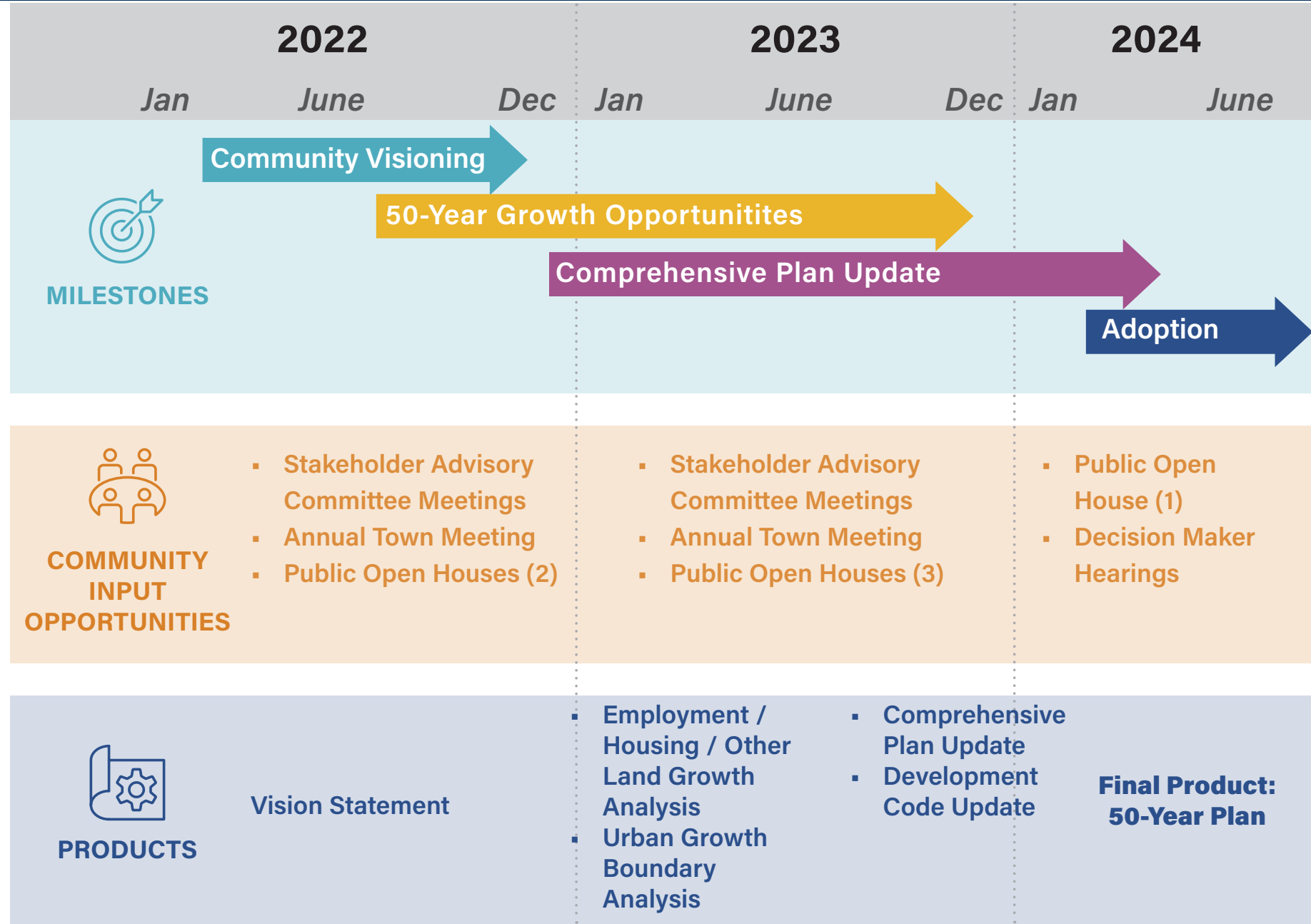

50-Year Plan Stakeholder Advisory Committee (SAC)

A successful process must create a **shared sense of ownership** among the Scappoose community.

The SAC will meet 12 times* representing a broad cross-section of **community interests**, **agency partners** and **service providers**.



** The ECONW / 3J team will meet with the SAC 12 times over the course of the project. APG, the HNA consultant, will also meet with the SAC at **4 additional meetings** to discuss the HNA update.*

50-Year Plan Stakeholder Advisory Committee (SAC)



The SAC will:

- Review and comment on work products
- Advise on technical issues
- Guide public outreach and engagement efforts
- Act as liaisons to specific constituencies or interest groups
- Encourage community members to participate in the process
- Act as champions of the ultimate 50-Year Plan that emerges from this process

Phase 1: Develop the Scappoose 50-Year Vision

Key Components:

Communication and Outreach Strategy

- Guide public and stakeholder interactions with the intention of creating opportunities for discussion, knowledge sharing, and problem-solving with community stakeholders.

Community Vision

- Guide the technical analysis in the project by providing input about community values and preferences.



Scappoose 50-Year Vision: Engagement Strategy and Activities

Phase 1 will be **highly visible and interactive** with the community.

The purpose of these activities is to understand **community desires, preferences, and priorities** about the **future of Scappoose**.

These values will be synthesized into themes that will constitute a **Vision Statement** for the 50-Year Plan.

Key Questions:

Where are we now?

Where are we going?

Where do we want to be?

How do we get there?

Who should be engaged?

How do you like to be involved?
