On April 20th nearly 100 community residents attended the 2019 Earth Day Festival in Heritage Park hosted by the City of Scappoose. The event was organized through a collaborative effort with the Friends of Scappoose Parks, the Scappoose Library, the Community Club along with several volunteers to celebrate Earth Day, community service, and our park system. The festival marked several important developments in the community, including: the activation of the Heritage Park fountain by artist Michael Curry for the season, the successful transfer of Chapman Landing from Columbia County to the City of Scappoose, and an opportunity for community volunteers to get involved with the Friends of Scappoose Parks.

The festival offered opportunities for attendees to learn about a variety of community organizations, participate in a volunteer activity with the Friends of Scappoose Parks, enjoy live music by a local group called the Big River Big Band, and various activities for children. The Friends of Scappoose Parks, with the help of the City's Public Works Department, redesigned the garden bed that surrounds the fountain at Heritage Park. Joy Creek Nursery, the Scappoose Bay Native Plant Nursery, Columbia Soil and Water Conservation District, and Means Nursery all generously donated or offered discounts on over 100 plants for the garden bed planting project. Several volunteers, including local Boy Scout Troop 294, showed up ready to do the work needed to complete the project.
