The City of Scappoose Utility Rate Increases for the 2021-22 fiscal year.

With the rising costs of materials and supplies necessary to operate our Water Treatment Facilities and the need for infrastructure replacement, the City of Scappoose has raised water rates by 2.5%.

Wastewater rates will increase by 7% to fund the Wastewater Treatment Plant Project and Stormwater rates will increase by 1.6% based on the ENR 20 city average CCI per Resolution No. 17-16.

Water Conservation

It's that time of year when the sun comes out and temperatures rise. With that comes increased water use. Water is unfortunately not limitless. The City of Scappoose is asking for your help to conserve water this summer.

You can help by taking a few easy steps:

- · Limit car washing
- · Wash only full loads of dishes or laundry
- · Avoid over watering of gardens and lawns
- · Set sprinklers to not spray on concrete or asphalt
- Water during the morning or evening
- · Reduce shower time
- Inspect your home for pipe, faucet, and toilet leaks
- · Consider installing high-efficiency faucets





Did You Know?

- · A 10-minute shower uses 15 20 gallons of water
- · One drip per second wastes 3,000 gallons of water annually
- · Dishwashers use a fraction of the water than hand washing
- On average, 30% of household water is flushed down the toilet


Scappoose incorporated on July 13, 1921 with a population of 151. Located on the Multnomah Channel, 20 miles northwest of Portland, Scappoose derived its name from Skáppus, a nearby Chinookan village.

Chinookan Chief Kiesno was the local area's principal Indian leader from 1811 to 1847. In the mid-nineteenth century, Euro-American re-settlers arrived choosing the area for its rich alluvial soil and plentiful fish and game. Over the years, Scappoose transformed from a dispersed frontier community, to a hub for logging operations, to an incorporated city.
