The City of Scappoose is pleased to announce the hiring of Shaun Davis as the Interim Chief of Police. The City worked closely with the Oregon Association of Chiefs Linebacker Interim Leadership Assistance Program to find the individual best suited to evaluate the police department and help navigate through this transitional period. Davis's qualifications and overall experience are an ideal fit for this task.



Shaun Davis is currently the Operations Captain for the Oregon City Police Department (OCPD). He joined OCPD as a reserve police officer in 1997, graduating from the Reserve Academy in the spring of 1998. In November 1998, Shaun was hired full time by OCPD and has been with the department for his entire career. During that time, Shaun has been a Patrol Officer, detective, K-9 Handler, Reserve Coordinator, Patrol Sergeant and Public Information Officer in addition to his current title. As Operations Captain, he oversees patrol along with several special assignment positions (Traffic, K-9, School Resource Officers, Homeless Liaison Officer, College Resource Officer, Bike Patrol, Public Information, SWAT, CNT, Honor Guard and

others). Davis has a Bachelor of Science in Criminology and Criminal Justice from Portland State University, is a graduate of the FBI National Academy, session 272, and has an executive level certificate through DPSST.

Interim Chief Davis began his tenure with the City on August 30, 2021.

Bring product in original container and Secure your Load

DO NOT BRING

- Unwanted/unused medicine/ pharmaceuticals (St Helens Police accepts Prescriptions)
- Asbestos
- Garbage or trash
- Liquid in containers larger than 5 gallons

BRING these items for recycling to the Transfer Station anytime it is open Monday-Saturday

- ⇒ Latex and Acrylic Paint, Oil-based Paint, enamel, stains, lacquers, shellacs, varnishes, primers
- ⇒ Used motor oil and antifreeze
- ⇒ Medical Sharps - must be in sealed, puncture-proof containers (available at the Transfer Station scale house)
- ⇒ Electronics— TV's, computers, monitors


