The Peace Candle has stood as one of the most visible and recognizable monuments in Scappoose for over 50-years. The Peace Candle was conceived of and designed by Darrel Brock, and built by Darrel, Leonard Stoudt, Richard Allmon, Richard Erickson, Delvin Phillips, and Jerry Phillips. Originally the Candle was real wax overlaid on a grain silo, and it had a real wick and a real flame! Since its construction the Candle has seen much history, change, and weather.

After 50 years, the Candle is in dire need of rehabilitative work. As many of you may know, planning for the rehabilitation of the Peace Candle has been in the works for a while now. We are pleased to report that work on the Candle has begun!

The first step, and possibly one of the most visible, was the removal of the flame assembly from the top of the candle in late December by NessCampbell Crane and Clark Signs. With their help we are now ready to truly begin rehabilitation of this iconic piece of Scappoose history.

Over the next months we will be assessing the state of the flame assembly. Information about this project will be presented to City Council during our regularly schedule public meetings, will be made available on our Facebook page, and posted in the City Newsletter.
