On the morning of Saturday April 30th, residents and community members gathered at Scappoose High School for the 7th Annual Town Meeting. The primary topic of focus was the City's 50-Year Plan, the comprehensive vision for how Scappoose will look and function in the future. Attendees heard from the consultant team how the 50-Year Plan will be used to prepare for the growth we expect to experience over the decades to come. After the presentation,

attendees broke into groups and began mapping out their vision for Scappoose. Each group was then able to present their ideas to the large group. Amazingly, every group proposed unique opportunities for Scappoose to consider as we grow. June 2022, City Manager Update

This past fiscal year has been very memorable for the Community, City Council and City Staff. First, the lingering impacts of COVID-19 Pandemic continue to influence many aspects of our personal and professional lives, although we are beginning to see some return to normalcy with the recent easing of mask restrictions in most settings. The City was the recipient of approximately \$1.6 million in COVID related emergency funds, via the American Rescue Plan Act, and, thus far, has allocated funds to cover the cost of water meters, an ambulance for the Scappoose Rural Fire District, support for the newly formed Small Business Resource Center and a new vehicle for the police department. City Council, in partnership with the citizen members of the Budget Committee, are still working diligently to determine how the remaining funds will be spent.

Second, the City Council bid farewell to Councilor Joel Haugen, who resigned in the winter of 2022, welcomed Councilor Jeannet Santiago to fill the vacant seat and set goals for FY 2022-2023. Those goals have since been incorporated into the FY 2022-2023 Budget.

Third, City Staff have remained incredibly busy and were able to address the day-to-day operations of the City while also making significant progress on many of the goals identified by Council in FY 2021-2022 including but not limited to:

- Completion of the Old Portland Rd. Sidewalk Infill Project projected for early June, 2022, funded by the local fuel tax
- Restoration of Peace Candle anticipated completion by August, 2022
- Scappoose 100 Year Celebration
- Police Department Events Halloween Drive Through and Donut Day
- Annual one-on-one meetings with neighboring local leaders
- Continuation of the City's voluntary sidewalk repair program
- Staff has expanded and continued communication outreach efforts through existing methods such as the City Newsletter and Facebook. Additionally, the City launched the City App, created a Nextdoor account, and is working on establishing an Instagram account
- The Grabhorn Park Design is being updated based upon the feedback received from the Grabhorn Park Ad Hoc Committee
- Progress has been made on Phase 1 of the Wastewater Treatment Plant upgrades
- Phases 1 & 2 of the Columbia Commerce Center have been platted and approximately 14 acres of park land has been transferred to the City

Looking forward to the new Fiscal Year, the proposed budget includes funding for many important projects, inclusive of both our core services and City Council's adopted goals which includes support for the first phase of the 50 Year Plan, local economic development such as the expansion of OMIC, community livability, public safety, support for the local park system and a comprehensive update of the Parks Master Plan and significant investments in aging infrastructure. Thanks to Senator Johnson, the City received approximately \$14 million dollars for water and wastewater projects and will be aggressively pursuing completion of those projects over the next 3-5 years to meet the deadlines associated with those funds. I want to end this message by thanking the City's wonderful staff for all their hard work and the City Council for providing thoughtful leadership and vision. I look forward to continuing to serve the community.
