September 2022 City Manager Update

This summer has been a productive time for the City and there are many exciting updates to share:

- The Parks Master Plan Update is now officially underway. The consultant team MIG was hired through an RFP process and the Parks Committee will be serving as the Technical Advisory Committee throughout the duration of the project. It's anticipated that this process will take one year to complete.
- The Urban Renewal Agency approved two new District Improvement grant programs, one for existing businesses and the other for new construction projects. Information on these programs is available at Scappoose Urban Renewal Agency - Business Improvement Grant Programs | City of Scappoose Oregon and questions on eligible projects may be directed to the Community Development Center.
- The Peace Candle rehabilition is ongoing. The renovations include updates to the wick, signage, new paint and lighting and landscaping around the base of the candle.
- The Grabhorn Park Concept update is progressing based upon the recommendations of the ٠ Grabhorn Ad Hoc Committee. As part of the concept development, a wetland delineation and arborist assessment will be completed. These reports will provide information needed to determine the most appropriate location of amenities identified and requested by the Committee.
- The City has welcomed new members to our management team including Police Chief Steven Lougal and Finance Administrator Carol Almer. Additionally, we've also hired new Patrol Officers, and an additional Utility Worker to help us continue to meet the needs of our growing community.

These are some of the key highlights from this summer's activity at the City. If you ever have questions about a specific project, please feel free to contact me. I hope to see you all at the Scappoose Adventure Festival on September 10th at Veteran's Park.

Finally, I want to express my gratitude to Council for their leadership and to City Staff for their hard work and diligence in implementing the vision set by Council. We have enjoyed many successes this past year and I look forward to many more!

Watts House Updates:

- Work is ongoing to rehabilitate the Watts House Museum.
- The Watts House will be open on September 10 from noon to 4pm for tours.
- On September 24 the society will be hosting a luncheon for the Dering family. There will be a rose planting in memoriam of the Dering Family.

On September 24th, the Scappoose Historical Society will honor E.P. (Mike) Dering, internationally known nurseryman, and founder of Peterson and Dering Nursery, Scappoose, Oregon.

Mr. Dering was one of the largest employers in Scappoose running a 150acre commercial rose nursery. Peterson and Dering was the largest rose nursery in the west for many years. At the age of 20 he founded Peterson and Dering. Mr. Dering operated the nursery in Scappoose from 1933 until retiring in 1963.

He was known in this country and Europe as a lecturer, author, and developer of new varieties of roses. Several of his patented varieties were All American Rose Selection (AARS) winners. Some notable roses he brought to market were Golden Slippers, Ebb Tide, Pink Favorite, Oregon Centennial, and Governor Mark Hatfield.

He was a multi-term president and treasurer of the Oregon Association of Nurseries, as well as past president of All-American Rose Selections, Inc., honorary member of the Portland Royal Rosarians, life member of the Portland Rose Society, and member of the American Association of Nurserymen and American Rose Society.

Many of his roses were in the International Rose Test Garden at Washington Park, Portland, as well as noted rose gardens around the world, including Butchart Gardens in Victoria, British Columbia.

He gave away thousands of rose plants to cities and civic organizations throughout Oregon and elsewhere - notably in Scappoose, St. Helens, Portland, and Salem (including the state capitol grounds).

With his wife Amy Kendall Dering they raised a family of five children. Mr. Dering was an avid outdoorsman, and was involved in many community activities such as the school board and several civic beautification projects.

Please join us and his family in celebration of his legacy at the Scappoose Historical Society Watts House memory garden.
