#### December 2022 City Manager Update

Dear Scappoose Community,

This past fall has been a very productive time for the City and I am happy to share our progress and accomplishments with you as we prepare to welcome in the new year.

• The City held our first ever Adventure Fest. It was widely attended and a lot of positive feedback was received regarding the focus on family friendly activities, local bands and vendors.

• The Urban Renewal Agency has received multiple applications for its newly established grant programs. Thus far, two awards have been made, the Healthy Smiles Project received \$15,000 and Cathedral Coffee received \$7,000. There are other applications still being considered for funding and the process remains open for additional applications.

• New conceptual plans for Grabhorn Park have been completed and shared with the Parks and Recreation Committee. Additionally, they have been made available to the consultant Team, MIG, who is completing the City's Parks Master Plan update. The Committee voted to incorporate further discussion on development of this park space into the Master Plan process rather than conducting it as a parallel process. There will be ample opportunities for the community to engage in the Parks Master Plan process including a survey, in-person outreach at community events, intercept surveys at local parks during recreation events, the Annual Town Meeting, City website and the City's social media accounts.

• Completion of the Peace Candle has been delayed due to supply chain issues related to the restoration of the wick. That said, the Candle has been repainted and all electrical work has been completed to ensure proper lighting.

• The Police Department hosted a Halloween Drive-Thru Event on October 31<sup>st</sup> and handed out candy and gift bags.

These are just a few of many projects City Staff have been working on over the last few months. If you ever have questions about a specific project, please feel free to contact me and or schedule a time to meet.

With the new year we are also welcoming in a new Council. I would like to acknowledge the contributions of the outgoing members and wish them well as they move on to pursue other endeavors. Additionally, I would like to congratulate and welcome all the new members of Council, I look forward to working with this group come January 2023.

Finally, I want to acknowledge and thank City Staff for all their hard work and dedication in implementing the vision of Council and addressing the City's day to day needs.

#### WHAT IS A STORM DRAIN?

Storm Drains are typically covered by grates with slats located near the edge of a street, see images below. These drains collect stormwater to help prevent localized flooding in the area. The stormwater then flows to the nearest stream or lake. Although not all city streets have a storm drain. Some older parts of town have wet-wells or collection basins which just hold additional stormwater until the ground can absorb it.

#### YOU CAN HELP PREVENT LOCALIZED FLOODING ON YOUR STREET

#### DON'T BLOW OR RAKE LEAVES ONTO THE ROADWAY

Blowing or raking your leaves onto the street is not permitted. The street sweeper is not able to sweep large piles of leaves as it causes equipment failures & your section of street could be skipped if large piles are in the street/roadway. Leaves on the street could also flow to a nearby storm drain and clog the drain.

#### RAKE LEAVES AWAY OR OFF STORM DRAINS

Keeping the storm drains or catch basins free of excess debris ensures they work properly to prevent localized flooding in the area. City & County crews work to keep all the storm drains clear, but with thousands of drains within Columbia County, a little help could go a long way and could help reduce property damage caused by localized flooding.

#### WHAT SHOULD I DO?

- Check storm drain grates frequently to make sure they are free of leaves & debris.
- Do not remove grates from the drain opening this does not unclog the system & creates a hazard.
- Rake leaves & yard debris away from storm drains near your home or business.
- Help keep leaves off the street.

If you noticed severe flooding on your street; call Public Works (503-543-8404).

#### TIPS FOR PROPER LEAF DISPOSAL:

- Dispose leaves in a compost bin
- Mulch leaves w/ lawnmower to spread on your garden or flowerbeds for winter nutrients
- Order a Waste Management yard-waste container (1-800-808-5901)
- Take your leaves to the following locations;
  - Columbia County Transfer Station 503-366-2613 (call for rates. Avg. truckload = 2-3 yards)

★ <u>Scappoose Community and Senior Center</u> @ 33342 SW Meadow Dr. (off SW 4<sup>th</sup>); will take leaves for FREE as compost on their community garden; can <u>only be leaves</u>, --NO grass clippings-- NO garbage-- NO tree trimmings or branches. They also accept soda cans in the appropriate bin which helps the Center raise funds.

#### **Fall Street Sweeping Reminder**

**Through December** 

Public Works' fall street sweeping schedule is active **through December**. During this time, Public Works will be street sweeping **curbed streets** each week.

#### Schedule

Mondays – West of Hwy 30 and South of EM Watts Tuesdays – West of Hwy 30 and North of EM Watts Wednesdays – East of Hwy 30 and South of Elm Street Thursdays – East of Hwy 30 and North of Elm Street

#### **Please Note**

- Raking or blowing leaves/debris from your property into the street is <u>prohibited</u> and can risk damaging the Street Sweeper.
- Crews may have to respond to emergencies and may not reach your street on a scheduled day.
- Please move any vehicles, trash bins, basketball hoops, or any other items off of **curbed streets** on the day of your zone.
- This schedule is subject to change.

#### News from Scappoose Fire District



Scappoose Fire District will begin fire inspections for commercial buildings starting January 2023.

Scappoose Fire District is committed to protecting lives and property against fire loss. The best way to protect against fire loss is prevention. Routine fire inspections are one of the most effective ways to prevent fires within the community.

The purpose of the fire inspections is to identify and correct violations of the fire code, and to educate business and property owners about fire safety. Routine fire inspection is scheduled ahead of time with business owners and/or their designees. In addition to prevention of fires within our community, the completion of fire inspections also benefits our communities' ISO score, which can result in savings on insurance premiums for our citizens.

An ISO fire rating is a score provided to fire departments and insurance companies by the Insurance Services Office. The score reflects how prepared a community and area is for fires. The number of fire inspections completed is factored into the risk evaluation for a community.


- November 15th, 11am: Tree decorating starts, to be completed before November 28th
