December 2023 City Manager Update

Dear Scappoose Community,

This past fall has been a very productive time for the City and I am happy to share our progress and accomplishments with you as we prepare to welcome in the new year.

- The Parks Master Plan project is nearing completion, a presentation of the complete draft document will be presented to City Council in a joint session with Planning Commission and the Parks and Recreation Committee in December.
- The Urban Renewal Agency, working closing with the Economic Development Committee, approved an updated grant program available to qualifying businesses located within the Urban Renewal Area. Applications and instructions can be found on the City's website.
- The City has initiated a Facilities Master Plan project. The plan will include a detailed analysis of the City's current and future facility needs, recommendations to meet those needs and conceptual designs and cost estimates for the recommended improvements. Tentative completion for this project is scheduled for April 2024.
- The Police Department has two new patrol officers who have been moved to solo status, Officer Johnson and Officer Burglin. Officer McFarland started his Police Academy training November 13th and will graduate from the Academy in March. Although not yet fully operational, the department is fully staffed and is working diligently towards 24/7 coverage.
- The City has partnered with the Columbia River PUD on two important projects, development of marketing materials for industrial properties in the South County area and frontage improvements on Columbia Avenue located between NE 2nd St. and NE Sawyer St. adjacent to their substation. The improvements include new concrete curbs, ADA ramps and sidewalks, driveways and overall street improvements which will increase accessibility for the community and improve the aesthetics of the area. Anticipated completion is mid December.
- The City's Branding Project is tentatively set to begin in mid December. This project will include a considerable amount of public engagement including open houses, pop up events, community conversations and will be featured at the Annual Town Meeting this coming spring.

These are some of the highlights from this past fall's activity at the City. If you ever have questions about a specific project, please feel free to contact me and, or schedule a time to meet.

Finally, I want to express my gratitude to Council for their leadership and to City Staff for their hard work and diligence in implementing the vision set by Council.

First place statewide winning students in each of the three categories will win \$500. Winners will be contacted in June for travel arrangements. Second and third place winning students win \$300 and \$100 respectively and will receive their prizes at local city presentations.
