Diaries from the Oregon and Trails Patricia Oberndorf


In 1849 twenty-one-year-old Benjamin Marion Watts headed out to California to join in the Gold Rush. In 1850 his eighteen-year-old brother John William Watts followed. In a few months, John returned home to Missouri and in 1852 hit the trail again, this time with his father and family to try settling in Oregon, where Ben met them. Both young men kept trail diaries telling of their travels and events along the way. This presentation will describe their diaries and what they tell us about the makings of this important Scappoose pioneer family.
