First day of school for Scappoose School District is Tuesday, September 3, 2024

Oregon law requires people driving cars or riding bikes to stop for people in all crosswalks, whether they are marked or unmarked. See Oregon Revised Statutes <u>ORS 801.220</u>, <u>ORS 811.005-811.065</u>.

YIELD. EVERY CORNER IS A LEGAL CROSSWALK.

Did you know that every corner is a legal crosswalk? Drivers are required by law to yield to pedestrians at ALL intersections—even if there is no marked crosswalk.

So avoid a ticket and give pedestrians a break by stopping when you see someone waiting to cross. And please be patient. Even if that pedestrian is the slowest human on earth. Even if you can turn in front of him without impeding progress. Even if you're in a big fat hurry; you shouldn't go until he's back on the curb.

Please wait your turn and obey the law by giving pedestrians the right of way at all intersections. It's the Street Smarts thing to do.


STAY ALERT, STAY ALIVE!

The City of Scappoose is a beautiful community that is filled with numerous individuals who commute on a daily basis on Highway 30 for commerce, work, business, and sometimes pedestrian traffic just to cross the street. During this past summer, law enforcement has noticed an uptick of collisions occurring on Highway 30 within the Scappoose City Limits resulting in injuries, and property damage that can result in vehicle damages that cost thousands of dollars. Even though there are numerous circumstances that can contributed to traffic collisions, almost every single traffic collision is preventable.

Officers of the Scappoose Police Department conduct traffic stops on Highway 30 to ensure the safety and security of our community and motorists who may be just passing through Scappoose on their way to the coast or other destinations. The Scappoose Police Department also investigates many of the traffic collisions that happen on Highway 30 within the city limits. However, despite the hard work of our officers, we cannot be everywhere all the time and that's why we are asking for YOUR help to ensure that everyone can make it home safely. This includes motorists, bicyclists, and pedestrians as well. To help make Highway 30 safer, here are a couple of things that YOU can do to help everyone arrive safely:

- Obey the posted speed limit while driving throughout the city which is primarily 35 mph while on Highway 30.
- Increase following distance between you and fellow motorists in front of your vehicle.
- Avoid using handheld cellular devices- it's the law.
- Avoid unnecessary distractions while driving. This includes extremely loud music, eating food, and applying makeup, are just a few examples.
- NEVER drink and drive! You can also be arrested for consuming marijuana (THC) or even prescription medication if it impairs your ability to operate a motor vehicle.
- Check pedestrian crosswalks, even if you think you have green light before proceeding into intersections that support pedestrian foot traffic.

In closing, its everyone's responsibility to ensure that we are safe on our roadways, so let's not just leave it to just law enforcement, because this is a team effort. Many people get so comfortable driving and operating a two-ton vehicle that can travel over 100mph that we don't consider if a vehicle strikes somethings unexpectedly, that the results often have devasting consequences. So, as school starts back up within our community, please follow the above tips so we all can make it home to our loved ones. Drive safely.





HOW DOES THE CITY USE THE MONEY WE COLLECT? Gas Tax from State (ODOT), City (Fuel Tax) and SDC Fees

The City receives revenues monthly from the State and from the city 3 cent per gallon fuel tax. These funds are restricted and can only be used for street and sidewalk operations, improvements and maintenance.
Street and Sidewalk Revenue Sources

- ODOT Federal gas tax distributed
- Scappoose 3 cent per gallon Fuel Tax
- Interest
- FEX Federal Exchange Funding
- System Development Fees (SDC) from building permits


The City maintains city owned streets but does not maintain Hwy 30 (maintained by ODOT) or Columbia

County owned roads (Like Keys Rd). ODOT also maintains the striping for intersections at Hwy 30. If we receive a complaint about a road that does not belong to the City we will notify ODOT or Columbia County.

Costs paid using Street funds include:



- Personnel Wages and benefits for street employees
- Materials & Services Operational expenses including paving, crack sealing, streetlights, striping, signs and other functions related to streets.
- Capital Projects Street improvement projects or equipment purchase. Recent projects include the Havlik drive sidewalk and street paving.

Street (Transportation) System Development fees are received from new development and can only be spent for projects in the plan that add to capacity of the system. These funds cannot be used for street maintenance, seismic or pothole repair. The City is currently using SDC funds for the Maple Street sidewalk project.

The City of Scappoose Public Works Staff has been crack sealing most of the summer. They have mainly worked in the SE area of the City. They started over by Otto Petersen Elementary in the Steinfeld area, then continued over by the High School on SE Frederick, SE 6th Street, and SE High School Way. In addition, they finished East Columbia Avenue from SE 4th Street to Highway 30. Thank you for your patience during this process.
