






## Where do the Property Taxes you pay go?

The City of Scappoose receives a portion of the property tax dollars you pay. The taxes are split by property between 18 agencies. Detailed data can be found on the County Assessor website <a href="https://www.columbiacountyor.gov/departments/Assessor">https://www.columbiacountyor.gov/departments/Assessor</a>.

The following chart shows the split of the taxes assessed for 2024. The City receives approximately 22.5 percent of the taxes (18.35% City and 4.5% Urban Renewal). The taxes received by the City are included in General Fund revenues to cover costs for governmental services including police, city administration, planning and parks departments.


