## <u>The City of Scappoose has been working with the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) to Improve Safety in Scappoose:</u>

Here's a brief snapshot of what's been completed:

- \* Updated traffic signal controllers at all the intersections throughout Scappoose along Hwy 30 and added remote communications to Havlik Drive, High School Way, EM Watts Road, Maple Street and Columbia Ave. The addition of the remote communication will allow the ODOT Traffic Engineer to monitor the system from Salem, if road conditions change (i.e. vehicular accident involving a signal pole and disabling the traffic signal) ODOT is able to respond immediately.
- \* Electricians worked on replacing the vehicle detection loops along Hwy 30 at Columbia Avenue and Maple Street; fixing the vehicle loops make the signals more efficient and responsive.
- \* The Signal Engineers are working with the ODOT Rail Division to update the signals at High School Way, Maple Street and at Scappoose- Vernonia Hwy/Crown Zellerbach Road to install a left green arrow that would only turn green in the event of a train. This would make it clearer to the drivers that they have a protected turn and they don't need to yield to pedestrians or oncoming traffic.
- \* The Signal Engineers are evaluating permissive flashing yellow left turn arrows (FYA) at various intersections throughout the Scappoose Hwy 30 corridor, including High School Way, EM Watts and Maple Street with proposed lane configuration changes at Maple Street.
- \* The Signal Engineers are also working with ODOT's Intelligence Transportation Systems (ITS) group to install Bluetooth devices at all the intersections in Scappoose; this would enable them to collect travel time data along the corridor. This information will assist with improving the commuter travel time through Scappoose.
- \* The City and ODOT will be working together to identify a funding source for adding technology that would track the school busses through the signal at High School Way and provide red light extension for the busses to safely pass through the intersection.
