As the City enters the dry month of August, we would like to ask all of you to conserve water on a voluntary basis. Please be mindful of the use of water and follow the conservation tips listed below:

Water Conservation Tips

- Don't use water to irrigate outdoor plants between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m.
- · Don't allow water to run off onto streets, sidewalks, driveways or adjacent property for more than five minutes.
- · Don't use water to wash sidewalks, walkways or other hard surfaces except where necessary for public health or safety.
- · Don't allow water to escape from breaks within a plumbing system.
- · Don't use water to wash cars, boats, trailers, aircraft or other vehicles by hose without using a shutoff nozzle.
- · Don't serve drinking water in restaurants, hotels, cafes or other public places unless requested by the customer.
- · Don't use water to clean, fill or maintain decorative fountains, ponds etc. unless the water is recirculated.
- · Don't use water for dust control or for washing buildings.

- * **Automatic Email Notifications**: new utility statements, processed utility payments, expiring credit cards, etc.

The City expects to receive bids by August 1st for construction and renovation of Heritage Park. The City received a \$180,000 grant to add playground equipment, a new fountain, and other amenities to the Park. Thanks to the support of the Columbia County Rotary and an Oregon State Parks Grant, we will be able to make significant improvements to this park. Our plans are for the project to be completed late this fall. Heritage Park is located between City Hall and the Watts House.

Park and Recreation Committee update
