2017 Annual Town Meeting

On February 11, 2017 over 100 Scappoose residents got up early to attend the 2nd Annual Town Meeting held at Scappoose Middle School. The town meeting focused on two topics: the City's buildable land inventory and the future of parks in Scappoose. Thanks to a generous \$4,200 donation from Comcast, participants were able to vote electronically and see the results in real time on several questions regarding parks and housing.

Many of the questions we asked about Parks received high levels of support:

90% of people supported a park at the new Seely Lane property.

81% of people supported hiking and biking trails at Vista Park.

81% of people supported a trail along South Scappoose Creek.

89.5% of people supported a 5 year park levy.

88% of people supported a new park taxing district.

The City also asked several questions about housing. Such as:

Should the city allow tiny houses in selected areas?

Should the city allow buildings up to 60 feet (about 5 stories) in the commercial zone?

Should the city allow multiplexes in the low density zone?
