The City is excited to announce that the Local Government Grant Application for the Park Project located off of Seely Lane has been awarded in the amount of \$445,000. This grant will allow us to develop a covered pavilion that will accommodate approximately 100 people, develop a restroom, playground area, basketball court and trails. It will be a perfect place for community gatherings, family picnics and will meet a real community need. This park will become Scappoose's 4th developed community park. Completion of the Park is tentatively scheduled for Fall 2018. The City would like to thank the Oregon Parks and Recreation Commission for selecting our project for funding.




Building Official Announces Retirement

The City would like to thank Columbia County Soil & Water Conservation District for their extraordinary efforts to help stabilized the serious erosion that has been occurring along South Scappoose Creek that had posed a serious threat to our community. Much of this damage was caused by heavy flooding that occurred during 2015. The flooding from this event caused serious bank erosion that exposed a major sewer trunk line and also caused erosion that could have eventually undermined our wastewater pump station.

Fortunately for the City, Columbia County Soil and Water Conservation District is very adept at dealing with these kinds of issues. Their experienced staff were able to secure funding to help our community address these potentially catastrophic threats and provide the expertise and oversight to actually repair the problem.
