The City has been working with ECONorthwest, who is doing a Housing Needs Analysis for the City of Scappoose, in order to determine how many and what type of housing units the City will need for the next 20 year planning horizon. This analysis is based on the adopted population forecast, which Portland State University provides for counties and cities every 4 years. For the City of Scappoose, the population estimate for the year 2035 is 10,461 residents. Our current population is 6,785.

In an effort to best utilize the residential land base in our current City limits, the City will be considering amendments to its development code chapters related to housing. Some, but not all, of the amendments being considered are; smaller minimum lot sizes in all residential zones, allowing cottage cluster housing developments, allowing more units in apartment buildings (the current code only allows for a maximum of 8 units per building), increasing the maximum height for apartment buildings, and requiring apartment buildings to incorporate architectural features.

The Planning Commission and City Councilors are holding a joint work session approximately once a month to review the proposed changes and we welcome public input on these topics of discussion.
