How Flashing Yellow Arrows Work

City Staff is please to announce that after a year of working closely with ODOT Officials, we finally have flashing yellow turn signals that will ease traffic flow through our community.

The City wants to thank ODOT for modernizing the traffic signals going through Scappoose. This was a concern that was clearly expressed at our 1st Annual Town Meeting.

Things you should know ~

When the flashing yellow arrow is displayed, left turns are allowed but drivers and bicyclists must wait behind the stop bar/crosswalk while watching for an appropriate gap in traffic. Drivers and bicyclists will then need to yield to oncoming motorists, bicyclists and pedestrians before making the left turn.



Waiting behind the stop bar/crosswalk during a flashing yellow arrow interval will also ensure that your vehicle or bicycle is detected by the signal's sensor equipment, which will provide a protected green arrow at the end of the cycle or at the start of the next cycle in case a gap in traffic never becomes available.

Motorists and bicyclists should not wait in the intersection for the traffic gap, as that is considered obstructing cross traffic which is a citable traffic offense (ORS 811.290).

Miller Park Update

Last fall, the City removed playground equipment from Miller Park because it was obsolete and dangerous. We are pleased to announce the City received a \$26,503 grant from Game Time that will help pay for the new playground equipment at Miller Park. This new equipment should be in place by later this fall.

Heritage Park

Heritage Park should be completed by early October with a dedication upon completion ~ please watch for more information on the City's website and Facebook. We hope all of you will come attend this event. With the invaluable support of the Rotary Club and Oregon State Parks, Heritage Park will become a community gem that will be very popular with the community.

Public Works Update

Summer time has been a busy time, for the City. Recently, the City purchased a new pavement roller which will help the City do more maintenance of City Streets.

Public Works Director Dave Sukau, has been with City since February, and has extensive experience paving and maintaining public facilities. Under his leadership, City crews are busy crack sealing and paving sections of City streets. These efforts will help the City develop safer streets, but, also help us protect our public investment in our City street system.
