Meet and Greet with Bill Blank – Community Club Vice Chair Bill Blank, standing in for Angela Hammond, came to meet the Committee and create a line of communication with the events sub-committee. Bill began by noting that the Council's Community Club Liaison is Brandon Lesowski and that he has been very reliable about attending meetings and serving as the connection between the Community Club and City. Bill then provided some background on the Community Club itself, he noted that it had been around for a long time and used to organize the Sauerkraut Festival, although that's since been discontinued due to low membership and volunteerism. The Farmers Market is starting on May 18<sup>th</sup> and will continue through September 28<sup>th</sup>, 2019. There will be several regular vendors and good. Bill mentioned that the Community Club hoped to receive some financial assistance from the City for music at these events. Bill noted that the Farmers Market can be an important tool for economic development, vendors can "get their feet wet" and see if what they have will sell. If they are successful, that can lead to a brick and mortar establishment. He went on to detail some of the events Community Club is still involved in, such as the annual Clean Up Day and Christmas lights. There is a desire to expand the Christmas Lights.



General Discussion – the Committee discussed throwing a Heritage Festival of sorts as a possible "signature" event. This could still include sauerkraut as a reminder of the City's heritage.
