ORDINANCE NO. 728

An Ordinance relating to land use and amending Sections 17.26.030 (Meaning of specific words and terms), 17.102.020 (Visual clearance --Required) and adding a new section, Section 17.102.030 (Clear vision area dimensions), to Title 17 of the Scappoose Municipal Code.

THE CITY OF SCAPPOOSE ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Scappoose Municipal Code Title 17 be amended as follows:

(Language to be omitted is strikethrough, language additions are in **bold italics**)

Chapter 17.26

DEFINITIONS

[...]

<u>17.26.030</u> Meaning of specific words and terms.

[...]

"Visual clearance area" means a triangular area on a lot at the intersection of two streets or a street and an alley, driveway, other point of vehicular access or railroad, two sides of which are lot lines measured from the corner intersection of the lot lines to a distance of twenty feet. *for distances as defined in Chapter* **17.102.** The third side of the triangle is a line across the corner of the lot adjoining the ends of the other two sides. Where the lot lines at intersections have rounded corners, the lot lines will be extended in a straight line to a point of intersection. The visual clearance area shall not contain visual obstructions.

Chapter 17.102

VISUAL CLEARANCE AREAS

Sections:

17.102.010 Purpose.

17.102.015 Applicability of provisions.

17.102.020 Visual clearance--Required.

17.102.030 Clear vision area dimensions.

<u>17.102.010</u> Purpose. The purpose of this chapter is to establish standards which will assure proper sight distances at intersections in order to reduce the hazard from vehicular turning movements. (Ord. 634 §1 Exh. A (part), 1995)

<u>17.102.015</u> Applicability of provisions. The provisions of this chapter shall apply to all intersections not regulated by traffic signals including private driveways. (Ord. 634 §1 Exh. A (part), 1995)

<u>17.102.020</u> Visual clearance--Required. A. A visual clearance area shall be maintained on the corners of all property adjacent to an unregulated intersection of two streets, a street and a railroad, or a driveway providing access to a public or private street.

B. A clear vision area shall contain no vehicle, recreational vehicle, watercraft, parts designed to be affixed to a vehicle of any type, hedge, planting, fence, wall structure, *sign*, or temporary or permanent obstruction (except for an occasional utility pole or tree), exceeding four feet in height, *that would impede visibility between a height of three (3) feet and ten (10) feet above the center line grades of the intersecting streets or railroad* measured from the top of the curb, or where no curb exists, from the street center line grade, except that trees exceeding this height may be located in this area, provided all branches below eight feet are removed.

C. Where the crest of a hill or vertical curve conditions contribute to the obstruction of clear vision areas at a street, or driveway **or railroad** intersection, hedges, plantings, fences, walls, wall structures and temporary or permanent obstructions shall be further reduced in height or eliminated to comply with the intent of the required clear vision area. (Ord. 634 §1 Exh. A (part), 1995)

D. The preceding provisions shall not apply to the following:

- 1. A public utility pole;
- 2. A tree trimmed (to the trunk) to a line at least eight (8) feet above the level of the intersection;
- 3. Another plant species of open growth habit that is not planted in the

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form of a hedge and which is so planted and trimmed as to leave at all seasons a clear and unobstructed cross-view;

- 4. A supporting member or appurtenance to a permanent building lawfully existing on the date this standard becomes effective;
- 5. An official warning sign or signal;
- 6. A place where the natural contour of the ground is such that there can be no cross-visibility at the intersection, and;
- 7. A sign support structure(s) if combined total width is 12 inches or less, and the combined total depth is 12 inches or less.

<u>17.102.030 Clear vision area dimensions.</u> A clear vision area shall consist of a triangular area two sides of which are lot lines for distances specified in this section, or, where the lot lines have rounded corners, the lot lines extended in a straight line to a point of intersection and so measured, and the third side of which is a line across the corner of the lot joining the nonintersecting ends of the other two sides. The following measurements shall establish the clear vision areas:

A. Street and railroad intersections:


Intersection Classification	Measurement along each lot line
All streets except alleys	30 feet
Streets and railroads	30 feet
Alley	10 feet
Intersection of a street and alley	20 feet


B. Driveway intersections:

1. Commercial, Industrial, Institutional, and Multi-Family developments. Service drives to public or private streets shall have a minimum clear vision area formed by the intersection the edges of the service drive, the street right-of-way line, and a straight line joining said lines through points 20 feet from their intersection. No off-street parking area shall be located in a service drive clear vision area.

2. Single-family and Two-family developments. Driveways to public or private streets shall have a minimum clear vision area formed by the intersection of the edges of the driveway, the street right-of-way line, and a straight line joining said lines through points 10 feet from their intersection. No off-street parking area shall be located in a driveway clear vision area.
