

CITY OF SCAPPOOSE PARKS, TRAILS, AND OPEN SPACE PLAN UPDATE


ABOUT THE PROJECT

The City of Scappoose is updating its long-term plan for parks, trails, and open space. Scappoose manages 11 park and recreation areas totaling over 130 acres.

The City strives to develop a diverse and accessible park system for people of all abilities within a 10-minute walk of their homes. The Parks, Trails, and Open Space Plan Update aims to plan a future park system that will achieve this goal.

THE PLAN PROCESS

The planning work consists of five phases, from the Summer of 2022 through the Summer of 2023. The project team are working to develop specific site recommendations, a capital improvement plan, and a vision and goal framework that will form the basis of the plan.



WE WANT TO HEAR FROM YOU!

There are currently seven developed city parks and four undeveloped city park properties in Scappoose.

What enhancements would you like to see at developed parks? Developed parks include:

- Chief Comcomly Park (3 acres)
- Creekview Park (2.7 acres)
- Heritage Park (2.6 acres)
- Miller Park (2 acres)
- Crown-Zellerbach Trail (1.3 miles)
- Trtek Trailhead (0.7 acres)
- Veterans Park (14 acres)

What ideas do you have for undeveloped parks? Undeveloped park properties include:

- Bella Vista (71 acres)
- Chapman Landing (16 acres)
- Commerce Drive Park (14.1 acres)
- Grabhorn Park (9.5 acres)

The ongoing efforts to update the conceptual plan for the Grabhorn property will be closely tied to this process and will help inform the final outcome.
