The Scappoose Planning Commission has scheduled a Limited Land Use Decision to consider an application for Modification of Approval MOA 1-17 for Site Development Review SDR7-96. Comments submitted in regard to the application should be directed toward applicable sections of Title 17 (Land Use and Development) of the Scappoose Municipal Code, with particular emphasis on Chapters 17.68 (EC, Expanded Commercial); 17.106 (Off-Street Parking and Loading Requirements); Chapter 17.120 (Site Development Review); and 17.164 (Procedures for Decision Making - Limited Land Use Decisions).
